As I am sure you are aware, from 10 December 2025, age-restricted social media platforms will have to take reasonable steps to prevent Australians under the age of 16 from creating or keeping an account. As a school we continue to learn more about how we will navigate the upcoming restrictions and how it will affect any plans or processes.

- understand the purpose of the new age restrictions and how they aim to protect young Australians
- understand which platforms will require users to be 16+ and what platforms they can still access
- get tips and resources to support your child's online safety and wellbeing through the transition.

Kanji Korner: JI (kawa, river)

The kanji **JII** began as three simple lines representing streams of water flowing side by side. It's one of the clearest pictographs in Japanese writing—still easy to recognise as a river's current.

Rivers and Daily Life

In Japan, rivers shape towns and traditions. Many place names include 川, such as Arakawa (荒川) and Tamagawa (多摩川).

Flow in Culture

The river symbolises movement and continuity. It flows steadily, just like time and life itself. In art and poetry, **JII** often stands for calmness, journey, and the link between people and nature.
